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## PURCHASING SCHOOL UNIFORMS

There are 3 ways to obtain School uniforms; via our onsite Uniform Shop, our online Uniform Shop and the secondhand uniforms Facebook page. Both the onsite and online Uniform Shops provide the full range of compulsory items for our students and additional accessories.

**Junior School students** – once an online purchase has been made the uniform will be placed in your child's school bag ready to bring home.

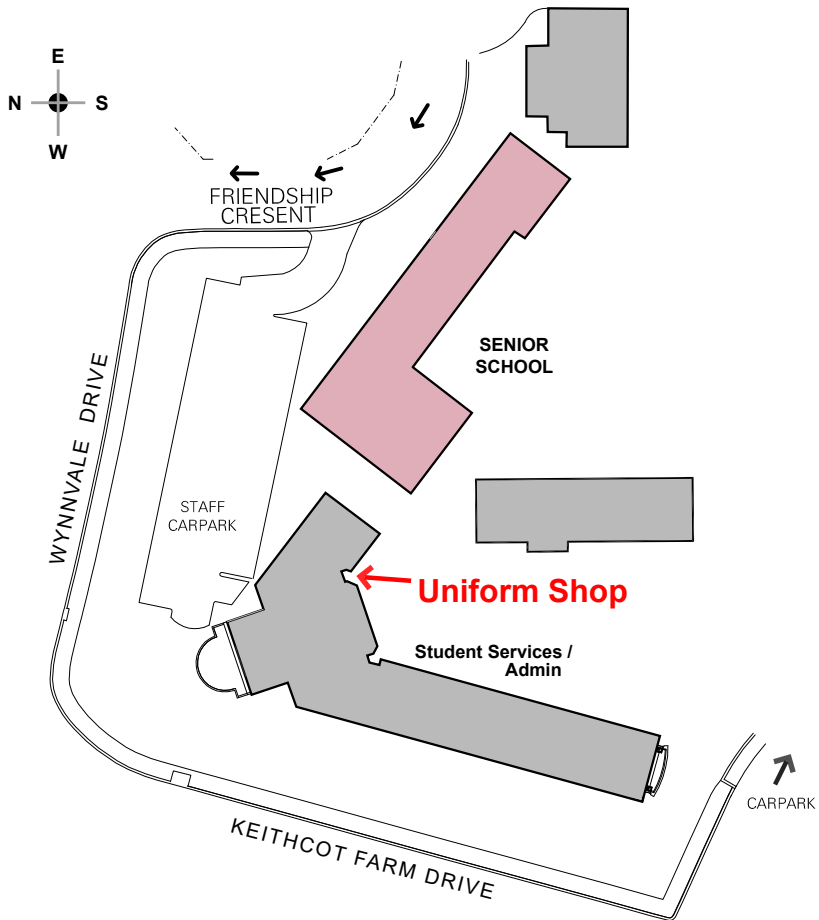
**Senior School students** – once an online purchase has been made an SMS will be sent to the student's parent and will be ready for collection from the onsite Uniform Shop.

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## UNIFORM VALUES AT KING'S

All students attending King's must wear the official school uniform and comply with the uniform policy at all times.

There is a long tradition at King's requiring students being in uniform. There has been active support from parents and staff over many years requiring students being in uniform. Parents want a uniform because it works, it keeps school attire simple and is easier than the alternatives.

There are many practical reasons schools adopt a uniform policy. There are also 'school culture' reasons for having uniforms.

**A School Uniform reflects what a School stands for as well as the values parents and the School trust that students will adopt as they mature and grow. A School Uniform creates a sense of belonging and community. The School Uniform engenders a sense of respect – for self, others and the School as an institution that the student belongs to.**

By wearing a uniform, a student is identified as a member of the King's community. The student declares "I belong to King's" in the same way as a football supporter wears the club colours to a game. This is the case whether, on the way to or from School, or at a sporting function outside of the grounds, as well as when actually at School. Students are part of a learning team or a learning community. Wearing a uniform reinforces a sense of community. We work together as a community, because this is a key value for life, which is, getting along with others to accomplish goals.

With belonging also comes a sense of identity and distinctiveness. The Crows colours are quite distinct to the Power. Likewise, King's colours and uniform helps King's students to be distinctive from other local schools. We identify by contrast with others and by standing alongside community members. Identity is formed not in isolation but in community.

The King's uniform carries with it a certain look which we believe speaks of high presentation standards, respect and appropriateness. These are values students can carry into their life. At the same time, the uniform enables all school members to feel comfortable about schoolwear. The uniform is considerate of others particular situations because it does not distinguish between students on the basis of wealth or home background.

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**Uniform items are to be worn in the manner in which they are designed and room for growth is sensible; wearing uniform oversized is not acceptable.**

- Gloves and scarves, when worn, must be plain school colours.
- Hair accessories must be plain school colours – no embellishments.
- Hair styles must not be extreme and remain within the province of the Principal's discretion.
- Jewellery is restricted to watches and girls only are allowed one pair of sleepers or plain studs (silver or gold – no embellishments) in lobes only.
- No make-up or nail polish is to be worn.

### **School Back Packs**

King's monogrammed school bags are compulsory for all students. They meet the recommendations by physiotherapists and chiropractors regarding back care.

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# JUNIOR SCHOOL UNIFORM – R-YEAR 5

## Summer Uniform

### Boys & Girls

- Jumper: Cherry red V neck jumper with embroidered logo.
- Hat: School hats with King's logo are compulsory. Hats must be worn in Terms 1 and 4.
- Shoes: Black leather (able to be polished) lace up or Velcro fully enclosed regulation school style.

### Boys

- Trousers: Tailored grey school trousers with embroidered logo.
- Shorts: Tailored grey school shorts with embroidered logo. Shorts are to be worn no longer than the top of the knee.
- Socks: Grey anklets.
- Shirt: Jac style white short sleeved shirt with embroidered logo on pocket. If concerned about sun protection, long sleeved shirts may be worn (not to be rolled up).

### Girls

- Dress: Green, white and red check (no longer than mid-calf and no shorter than knee length).
- Socks: White anklets.

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## Winter Uniform

### Boys & Girls

- Tie: Tartan. Tie must be worn with the top shirt button fastened.
- Jumper: Cherry red V neck jumper with embroidered logo.
- Shoes: Black leather (able to be polished) lace up or Velcro fully enclosed regulation school style.

### Boys

- Shirt: Jac style white long sleeved shirt with embroidered logo on pocket.
- Trousers: Tailored grey school trousers with embroidered logo.
- Socks: Grey anklets.

### Girls

- Tunic: Tartan (worn no longer than mid-calf and no shorter than knee length)
- Blouse: White embroidered long sleeved.
- Tights: Bottle green non-ribbed 70 denier
- Socks: White, knee high socks. Long socks are not to be rolled down or worn with tights.

### Optional

- Parka: Polar fleece, lined embroidered coat.

## Sports Uniform

### Boys & Girls

- Shorts: Navy monogrammed shorts.
- Shirts: Navy, red and gold short sleeved polo.
- Socks: King's white sports socks.
- Sneakers: Supportive cross-trainer (basketball boots and skate shoes not permitted) with non-marking soles.
- Trackpants: Navy microfibre with ankle zips (to be closed when worn and not to be rolled up).
- Jacket: Navy, red and gold microfibre with embroidered logo.

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# MIDDLE SCHOOL UNIFORM – YEAR 6-9

## Summer Uniform

### Boys & Girls

- Jumper: Cherry red V neck jumper with embroidered logo.
- Hat: School hats with King's logo are compulsory. Hats must be worn in Terms 1 and 4.
- Shoes: Black leather (able to be polished) lace up regulation school style.

### Boys

- Trousers: Tailored grey school trousers with embroidered logo.
- Shorts: Tailored grey school shorts with embroidered logo. Shorts are to be worn no longer than the top of the knee.
- Socks: Grey anklets.
- Belt: Black belt if required.
- Shirt: Jac style white short sleeved shirt with embroidered logo on pocket. If concerned about sun protection, long sleeved shirts may be worn (not rolled up).

### Girls

- Tie: Tartan (must be worn with the top shirt button fastened).
- Jumper: Cherry red V neck jumper with embroidered logo.
- Shoes: Black leather (able to be polished) lace up regulation school style, as displayed in the Uniform Shop.

### Boys

- Shirt: Jac style white long sleeved shirt with embroidered logo on pocket. Sleeves should not be rolled up.
- Trousers: Tailored grey school trousers with embroidered logo.
- Belt: Black belt if required.
- Socks: Grey anklets.

### Girls

- Kilt/Skirt: Tartan, (worn no longer than mid-calf and no shorter than knee length).
- Blouse: White embroidered long sleeved. Sleeves not to be rolled up.
- Tights: Bottle green non-ribbed 70 denier.
- Socks: Bottle green.

### Boys & Girls

- Shorts: Navy monogrammed shorts.
- Shirt: Navy, red and gold short sleeved polo.

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# SENIOR SCHOOL – Year 10-12

## Summer Uniform

### Boys & Girls

- Jumper: Cherry red V neck jumper with embroidered logo.  
Hat: School hats with King's logo are compulsory. Hats must be worn in Terms 1 and 4.  
Shoes: Black leather (able to be polished) lace up regulation school style, as displayed in the Uniform Shop.

### Boys

- Trousers: Tailored grey school trousers with embroidered logo.  
Shorts: Tailored grey school shorts with embroidered logo. Shorts are to be worn no longer than the top of the knee.  
Socks: Grey anklets.  
Belt: Black belt if required.  
Shirt: Jac style white short sleeved shirt with embroidered logo on pocket. If concerned about sun protection, long sleeved shirts may be worn (not rolled up).

### Girls

- Dress: Green, white and red check, (no longer than mid-calf and no shorter than knee length).  
Socks: White anklets.

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## Winter Uniform

### Boys & Girls

- Blazer: Bottle green with monogrammed pocket. May be worn all year round and are compulsory with the Winter Uniform.
- Tie: Tartan (must be worn with the top shirt button fastened).
- Jumper: Cherry red V neck jumper with embroidered logo.
- Shoes: Black leather (able to be polished) lace up regulation school style, as displayed in the Uniform Shop.

### Boys

- Shirt: Jac style white long sleeved shirt with embroidered logo on pocket. Sleeves should not be rolled up.
- Trousers: Tailored grey school trousers with embroidered logo.
- Belt: Black belt if required.
- Socks: Grey anklets.

### Girls

- Kilt/Skirt: Tartan, (worn no longer than mid-calf and no shorter than knee length).
- Blouse: White embroidered long sleeved. Sleeves not to be rolled up.
- Tights: Bottle green non-ribbed 70 denier.
- Socks: Bottle green.

## Sports Uniform

Students in Years 11-12 must only wear their PE uniform to and from school when they have PE lessons 1/2 or 5/6 respectively. They are to change between their formal and PE uniforms at the break adjacent to their PE lesson.

- Shorts: Navy monogrammed shorts.
- Shirt: Navy, red and gold short sleeved polo.
- Socks: King's white sports socks.
- Sneakers: Supportive cross-trainer (Basketball boots and skate shoes not permitted) with non-marking soles.
- Trackpants: Navy microfibre with ankle zips (to be closed when worn and not to be rolled up).
- Jacket: Navy, red and gold microfibre with embroidered logo

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## **Tattoos**

A King's student under 18 is not permitted to have a visible permanent tattoo (visible in any of King's registered uniforms – summer, winter, sports).

If an 18 or over student has a tattoo it needs to be in keeping with the school FISHER principles.

If a student under 18 has a visible permanent tattoo their enrolment will be withdrawn.

## **Years 10-12 students only**

The following privileges are afforded to students in Years 10-12.

All privileges are subject to the discretion of the Senior School management and Senior School Co-ordinators.

1. The wearing of a chain and pendant of a Christian symbol, e.g. crucifix, is permitted.
2. Discreet make-up is acceptable.
3. Neat, trimmed facial hair is permitted for Year 12 students only.

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## THE STANDARD

### Breaches of Uniform Policy

The School's policy is that the prescribed uniform should be *correctly* worn.

The main offence is in the way the uniform is worn:

- ties worn with the top button of the shirt undone and the tie at "half-mast"
- wearing clothes that are far too big or small for them
- wearing items which are not part of the uniform e.g. black tracksuit pants, make up, non-regulation school bags, jewellery
- School hats: either not worn or incorrectly worn.

### The response to being out of uniform

Students are made aware of the standard and how their dress falls short of the standard. Students are expected to rectify the problem by following instructions and thus bring their uniform into line with the code/standard. This is very simple for staff to administer. In most cases, it should be possible for the student to rectify the uniform problem on the spot.

### Lacking an item

If a student is lacking an item, then the matter might be sorted in a number of ways. The student might borrow the item from the School for the day (notification in the diary), purchase the item (receipt in the diary or notification of charge to the fee account of the student) and, depending on previous warnings, they might need to report to the Director or Pastoral Co-ordinator the next day in correct uniform with parent note.

### Continual uniform warning

The policy of the school for student behaviour is for a teacher to manage behaviour at the informal level of reminders and redirections and giving clear instructions. However, if that is not making a difference (i.e. the offending behaviour continues) then teachers will refer the issue to the Pastoral Co-ordinator (via a referral slip in the diary).

A student continuing to breach uniform standards will come under the schools Behaviour Management Policies.
